





He founded Blue Zones®, a company that puts the world's best practices in longevity and well-being to work in people's lives.



### Chapter Membership Campaign

### What is it?

- A challenge for local Chapters and State Chapters with no local chapters to increase their overall membership.
- State and Northeast Regional chapter are excluded. (Unless there are no regional or local chapters in the State)

### How?

- Chapters are asked to recruit non-members, and
- Encourage renewals of current and past members.

### When?

 The campaign was scheduled to run from February 1, 2013 – January 31, 2014 but has been extended until February 28, 2014.

### So What?

Increasing membership: Chapters eligible to win prizes.



## Chapter Membership Campaign

### How?

- Membership numbers have been tallied and an average membership number has been calculated for each chapter for the period - February 1, 2012 through January 31, 2013. This will serve as the baseline.
- Membership will be counted for each chapter from February 1, 2013 through February 28, 2014. The total number of members in each chapter will be compared to the previous year's baseline to determine the percent increase.



## Chapter Membership Campaign

### **Prizes**

- Grand prizes-3 Chapters with the highest percentage increase will receive an iPad (with Skype paid for 1 year).
- Increase membership by 25%- 4 archived webinars, a gold "medal" for each chapter member attending the 2014 National Conference.
- Increase membership by 15 % 2 archived webinars, a silver "medal" for each chapter member attending the 2014 National Conference.
- Increase membership by 10%- 1 archived webinar, a bronze "medal" for each chapter member attending the 2014 National Conference.
