2025 FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

The **AAOHN Foundation** was established in 1997 to advance the health, safety and well-being of workers, worker populations, and communities through the development of innovative research, education and training solutions. One way in which this purpose is accomplished is by advancing knowledge in occupational and environmental health through the awarding of grants and scholarships to occupational and environmental health professionals to support ongoing education and research.

Grant Eligibility: Current AAOHN Foundation Board of Trustees, AAOHN Board of Directors, Grants Selection Committee members and their relatives are not eligible for grants.

Application Deadline – Complete applications must be emailed to <u>aaohnfoundationhq@gmail.com</u> on or before <u>February 1, 2025</u>. The APPLICATION FORM (located on page 4) and narrative document plus appendices should be submitted together and are required for each submission. Purpose - To encourage research in the field of occupational and environmental health by new principal investigators.

Funds Awarded: MEDIQUE PRODUCTS (\$3,000— one award) The *AAOHN Research Priorities* are to be used as the primary guide/reference for possible topics and will be given preference in funding.

Eligibility Criteria - This grant allocates funds to occupational and environmental health nurses who are new investigators to conduct research on occupational and environmental issues.

- Minimum one-year AAOHN national membership is required.
- Proposals may be submitted that are in the early stages of development (prior to data collection); however, completed research projects will not be accepted for consideration.

Acceptance of this funding is based on the following stipulations:

- The project will be completed according to the timeline provided in the proposal. If timely completion of the project is not possible, grant funds are to be returned unless a new project completion date has been approved (in writing). Contact the AAOHN Foundation if you find that you must deviate from the timeframe submitted with your proposal.
- Upon completion of the project, a final report, including budget reconciliation, is to be submitted to the AAOHN Foundation including a testimonial as to how you see this project benefitting the field of occupational health and occupational health nursing.
- Any presentation or publication of this research project must credit the AAOHN Foundation and the named organization's grant support.
- Submission for oral or poster presentation of research at the AAOHN National Conference and publishing results in the *AAOHN Workplace Health and Safety* is required.

Selection Criteria - Submit a narrative document of no more than 15 double-spaced pages with 1-inch margins in 12-point font that addresses the following weighted criteria:

- 15% Purpose of project: State the overall objective(s) or specific aims and long-term goal(s) of the project. Address the relevance of the project to occupational and environmental health.
- 10% Significance of project: Defend why it is important to conduct this research.
- 5% Potential impact: Address the potential impact of research on occupational and environmental health and/or occupational and environmental health nursing.
- 15% Review of literature: Brief review of the literature, including significance of the project. Outline the background to the proposal. Concisely state importance of the project described by relating specific aims to long-term goals.
- 25% Methods: Include specific measurable objectives, description of the target population and characteristics of the subjects, rationale for sample size and sampling procedure, plan to protect the research subjects' rights, and a discussion of the design and the data collection procedures.
- 20% Plans for data analysis: Describe in detail how the data will be analyzed and interpreted to accomplish the aims.
- 10% Assumptions and limitations: Discuss potential difficulties and limitations of the study and any appropriate assumptions used in the design of the study.
