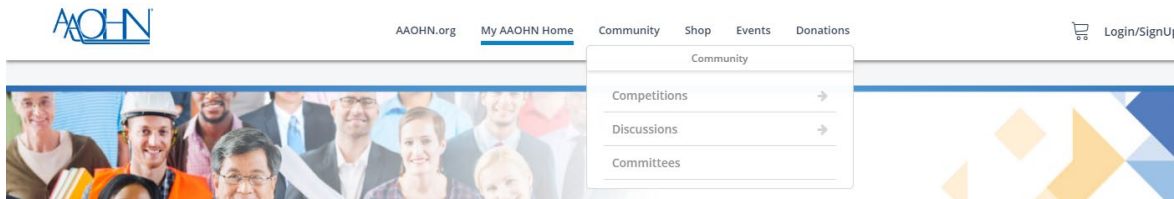

Proposals must:

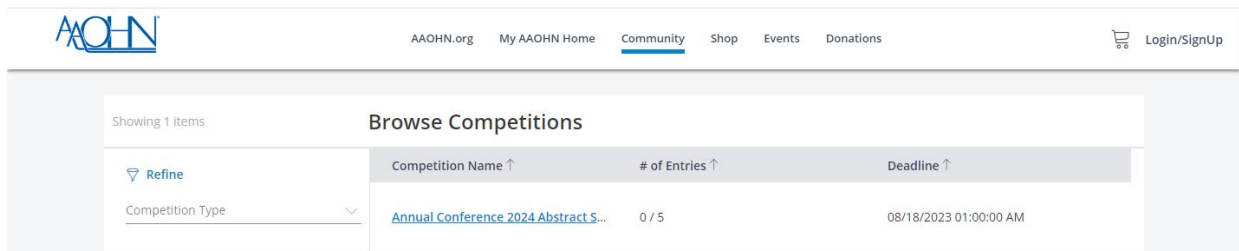
- demonstrate a **concise** statement of significance of the topic;
- be relevant to the anticipated audience needs for education at **intermediate or advanced levels of practice**;
- focus on **leading-edge** subjects of interest to those working in **any** occupational health setting;
- be appropriate for both the OHN RN and the APRN/NP audience; offer sufficient detail to demonstrate the application of the topic for presentation; and
- pertain to occupational health nursing research, evidence/solution-based clinical practice, disability management, safety, health promotion, leadership, business/management and policy initiatives.

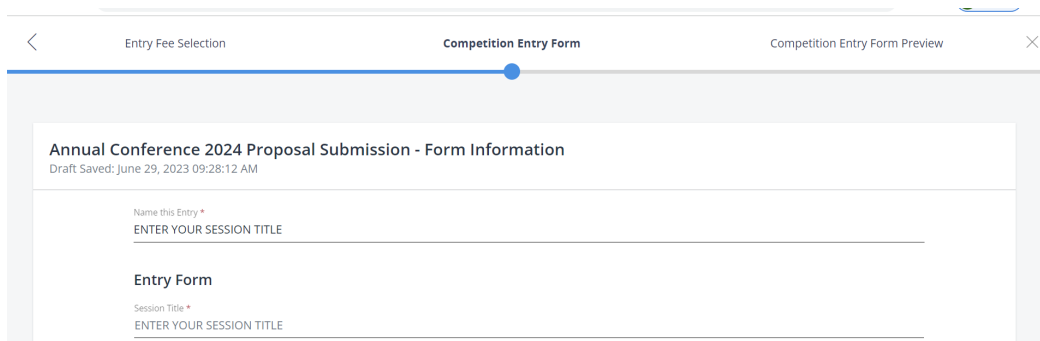
- Login to your AAOHN account. * All submitters must have a [Member or Guest Account](#).
- If you are creating a new account, follow the prompts to create a profile.
- You will need to select MY AAOHN and then Community for Competitions to submit your proposal at [AAOHN24](#)



- Select View Open Competitions to select the Annual Conference 2024 Proposals. Then Select the Annual Conference 2024 Proposal Submission



- You may review your submission or submit additional proposals through the deadline

Author proposals are welcome and will undergo an open, competitive peer-review process for selection. Keep in mind that proposals will score highest on topics that reflect leading-edge, evidence-based, forward-thinking and innovative topics, address mid- and advanced-levels of practice and are appealing to a large number of conference attendees. Proposals that do not show clear and accurate interpretation of implications and recommendations for practice gaps, education, research, and/or policy for one or more of the occupational health nursing subspecialties will not be accepted. Proposals received after the deadline will not be reviewed.
